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Become a Critical Practice Tutor at the LSA for 2024/25

1.1 Introduction

The London School of Architecture is seeking applications for exceptional tutors who can support the Critical Practice module in its two-year MArch in Designing Architecture (ARB/RIBA Part 2) programme.

Critical Practice at the LSA is an analytical module in Year One that explores students' experiences in their practice placement as well as speculating on forms of future practice. Students are asked to each produce a Manual and a Manifesto respectively to support their position in the design portfolio.

We welcome applications from:

- experienced architectural practitioners who would like to help our students explore critical perspectives on contemporary practice and help create the next generation of critical and ethical practitioners.
- practitioners who would like to help post-graduate students develop their writing and research methodologies in new and imaginative ways.
- all applicants should have an exceptional ability to fire students' imaginations about architectural agency, and inspire questions on the ethics of the profession and more.

The LSA has an equal opportunities policy and seeks for its faculty to reflect its ambitions to widen access to and participation in the architectural profession.

1.2 Requirements

Applicants should:

- subscribe to the mission for the school and be able to make a critical contribution to it: www.the-lsa.org/about/purpose/
- be experienced tutors with at least four years' teaching experience (i.e. not just as a visiting critic)
- practitioners from a range of built environment disciplines with at least four years in practice
- be available to teach in our studio in East London
- preferably be practicing in London, in your own practice or as an employee

1.3 How to apply

- please make clear in your covering letter which of the programme areas is of specific interest to you as well as your level of practice and teaching experience
- interviews will be during the weeks of the 22 and 26 July 2024
- position commences in September

1.4 Time Commitment

Tutors are asked to commit to one half day session per week for the duration of the academic year (September to May). There will be some additional full days for reviews and marking on confirmation of timetable.

Tutors are required to produce written formative and summative feedback in a timely manner according to the framework set out in the LSA Operations Manual. They must adhere to the marking and moderation framework in line with the academic regulations set out by the LSA's academic partner, the University of Liverpool.
