# Become a Design History Tutor at the LSA for 2024/25

---

## 1.1 Introduction

The London School of Architecture is seeking applications for exceptional tutors who can support the Design History module across its two-year MArch in Designing Architecture (ARB/RIBA Part 2) programme.

Design History at the LSA is an analytical module in Year Two that asks students to consider through an historical perspective how architects have approached the task of design, and how this can be instructive for the development individual student projects. The module is closely aligned to both Design Thesis and Design Tectonics to ensure all aspects of historical research are embraced from construction history through to social, political and cultural agendas.

We welcome applications from:

- architectural historians with a range of interests and methodological approaches particularly in progressing an ever-expanding breadth of cultural knowledge and understanding
- experienced architectural practitioners who would like to share a deep knowledge of the histories of architecture and the built environment
- architectural historians and practitioners who would like to help post-graduate students hone their writing and research methodologies.
- those who are eager to engage in the LSA's innovative pedagogic model of uniting practice and academia by re-thinking how history and historical thinking can enrich contemporary practice

## 1.2 Requirements

Applicants should:

- be experienced tutors with at least four years' teaching experience (i.e. not just as a visiting critic)
- early career practitioners to have at least four years in practice

- be available to teach in our studio in East London
- preferably be practicing in London, in your own practice or as an employee

**1.4 Time Commitment**

Tutors are asked to commit to one half day session per week for the duration of the first term (October 2024 to January 2025). There will be some additional full days for reviews and marking on confirmation of timetable.

Tutors are required to produce written formative and summative feedback in a timely manner according to the framework set out in the LSA Operations Manual. They must adhere to the marking and moderation framework in line with the academic regulations set out by the LSA's academic partner, the University of Liverpool.
